Michaelmas Term is a time for new beginnings: academic, social, personal. Our sermons and addresses at Sunday Evensong this term are united by that same theme. By exploring key passages in John's Gospel, our speakers will reflect on how these ancient words can open up fresh vistas of possibility for us, and offer striking insights into our deepest questions around meaning, purpose and belief.

Thomas Habib is a graduate student at Clare, and has recently completed his PhD at the Faculty of Divinity. His doctoral research focussed on methods of characterisation in John's Gospel, and the influence of Hellenistic themes in the text. Paula Gooder is a distinguished New Testament academic, and one of the world's leading Anglican theologians. Since 2019 Dr Gooder has been the Chancellor of St Paul's Cathedral. Her recent publications include *Phoebe* (2019), an innovative study of early Christianity, and *Lydia* (2022). Stephen Cottrell has served as the Archbishop of York since 2020, following a decade as Bishop of Chelmsford. The author of more than twenty books, Archbishop Stephen also sits in the House of Lords, and is one of the two most senior clerics in the Church of England. Niv Lobo studied English Literature at Clare from 2009 to 2012, and, following theological training in Oxford, now serves as the Curate of Christ Church Portswood in the Diocese of Winchester.

# HOLY COMMUNION

A simple and peaceful morning service every Sunday morning at 10 a.m., including a short sermon, and lasting about half an hour. Followed by coffee and tea, toast and pastries, in E3. At breakfast on 9 October, there will also be a chance to hear about the variety of churches in Cambridge. On 30 October, we are joined by the Chapel congregation of Trinity Hall, followed by a free cooked breakfast back at their Buttery. On 13 November, Holy Communion is replaced by the special morning Service for Remembrance Sunday in Chapel at 10.45 a.m. Our sermons at Holy Communion in Michaelmas Term explore the opening chapters of Luke's Gospel.

# RECITALS

Each Sunday during full term there is a recital in Chapel at 5.25 p.m. before Evensong. Visitors are welcome, and admission is free. The recital is a preparation for the worship to follow, and those present are invited to reflect and meditate silently during the musical offering. There are no recitals on 13 November (Remembrance Sunday) or 27 November (Advent Sunday).

# MUSIC

Musical highlights this Term include a liturgical performance of Duruflé's Requiem for All Souls' (1 November), Finzi's *Lo, the full, final Sacrifice* as part of our special service for Remembrance Sunday (13 November), and the first performance of a new work by Clare third-year Music student Gregory May (13 October). Alongside established works in the repertoire the Choir continues to explore lesser-known works, including works by Amy Beach, Arnold Bax, Samuel Coleridge-Taylor, Maxine Thévenot, and works written for the Choir by Lucy Walker and Victoria Longstaff.

The Choir joins the Choir of Gonville and Caius College, Cambridge for a joint service of Choral Vespers in their Chapel (25 October), and welcomes the girl choristers of Guildford Cathedral Choir for a joint service of Choral Evensong in our own Chapel (15 November). In September the Choir sings Choral Evensong at St Andrew's, Stapleford (29 September) and in November records an Epiphany Carol Service (24 November) – which includes the first performance of a new commission from Cecilia McDowall – in the Chapel, broadcast on BBC Radio 3 on 4 January 2023. Congregation are asked to be seated for this service by 6.05 p.m.

The two popular Clare Advent Carol Services this year take place on Saturday 26 November and Sunday 27 November (admission by ticket only). A Staff Carol Service is given in Chapel on Thursday 1 December.

During the December vacation, the Choir is joined by the Orchestra of the Age of Enlightenment and an outstanding line-up of soloists for a performance of J. S. Bach's *Christmas Oratorio* (Parts I, II, III & VI) in Trinity College Chapel (3 December). Later in December the Choir performs their festive programme, *A spotless rose*, in concert in Wiltshire (10 December), St John's, Smith Square, London (18 December, 5 p.m.), and overseas in the Netherlands. This Michaelmas Term, accompanied by cheese, wine and other refreshments, we'll be reading our way through Madeline L'Engle's 'A Wrinkle in Time' – a profound and award-winning young adult novel full of mystery and adventure. The tale begins on a dark and stormy night and takes us on a perilous journey through the universe – by way of strange creatures, life-changing decisions, and provocative questions. It is the first in L'Engle's 'Time Quintet', and promises a fun and relaxing Tuesday evening as we meet to enjoy and discuss the story (and perhaps, towards the end of term, a great movie night as we watch the recent film adaptation). # A COMMEMORATION OF HUGH LATIMER

At Evensong on Thursday 13 October, we commemorate the life and martyrdom of Clare alumnus Hugh Latimer. Latimer was a Fellow of Clare, later Bishop of Worcester, and was burnt at the stake in Oxford in October 1555.

# **COVER IMAGE**

The cover image is *The Calling of Saint Matthew* by Caravaggio, completed in 1600 and hanging in San Luigi dei Francesi in Rome. It dramatically depicts a 'new beginning' for Matthew, the tax collector who became a disciple. Christ stands at the right of the picture, his hand pointing at Matthew, who sits at the table bathed in light. Matthew looks rather surprised, gesturing towards himself as if to ask, 'Me?'. Caravaggio's painting subtly reveals both the unexpected nature of Christ's call, but also the beauty of divine love breaking into the everyday.
