In her Preamble to the Statutes, Lady Clare expressed her desire that the members of her College should 'discover and acquire the precious pearl of learning'. Our Foundress was alluding to a parable told by Jesus, in which the kingdom of heaven is compared to a merchant who, having found one pearl of great price, went and sold all that he had, and bought it (Matthew XIII: 45-46). The parable points to the all-surpassing value of the kingdom of heaven, and the great joy that comes in finding God. Our sermons and addresses at Sunday Evensong services this term will help us to reflect on this theme, by considering how we might discover the truth and beauty of God in the complexities of our academic studies, and amid a world marred by suffering and conflict.

Professor Jeremy Begbie is the Thomas A. Langford Distinguished Professor at Duke Divinity School, North Carolina, and his research focuses on the relationship between Christianity and the Arts. A professional musician, Professor Begbie has a particular interest in the interplay between music and theology, and is an Affiliated Lecturer at the Faculty of Music in Cambridge. Saju Muthalaly grew up in South India and came to faith as a teenager. Following ordination in 2008, he served in parishes in the diocesses of Carlisle and Rochester before being consecrated as Bishop of Loughborough in 2022. Saju is the youngest bishop in the Church of England, and a keen cricketer. Dr Chloë Reddaway is a Research Fellow at King's College, London, where her work focusses on visual theology and Christian art, with a particular interest in the potential of historic works of art for contemporary theology. Her publications include Strangeness and Recognition: Mystery and Familiarity in Renaissance Paintings of Christ (2019). Dr David Randall read Medicine at Cambridge, after which he worked as a doctor in various hospitals in east London, whilst also completing a PhD at Oueen Mary. He is currently a Consultant in Renal Medicine at the Royal London Hospital. Loretta Minghella became the 46th Master of Clare in 2021, and is herself an alumna of the College, graduating in 1984. From 2010-17, Loretta served as the Chief Executive of Christian Aid, where she oversaw responses to natural disasters, refugee crises and hunger and famine emergencies, and led long-term development work and advocacy on major issues affecting the world's poorest people. In 2017, she was appointed as the first female First Church Estates Commissioner, overseeing the Church of England's £10bn investment portfolio. The Rev'd Dr Philip Stewart is a General Practitioner in Comberton, and also ministers at St Botolph's Church in Cambridge, where he is the Assistant Curate. Professor Douglas Hedley has been a Fellow of Clare since 1996, and is the Professor of the Philosophy of Religion at the Faculty of Divinity. In addition to his many research interests and publications, Professor Hedley is the Director of the Cambridge Centre for the Study of Platonism.

HOLY COMMUNION

A simple and peaceful morning service every Sunday morning at 10 a.m., including a short sermon, and lasting about half an hour. Followed by coffee and tea, toast and pastries, in E3. At breakfast on 8 October, there will also be a chance to hear about the variety of churches in Cambridge. On 29 October, we are joined by the Chapel congregation of Trinity Hall, followed by a free cooked breakfast back in their Hall. On 12 November, Holy Communion is replaced by the special morning Service for Remembrance Sunday in Chapel at 10.45 a.m, and on 26 November Holy Communion is replaced by the Choral Eucharist for Christ the King at 11 a.m. Our sermons at Holy Communion in Michaelmas Term continue our exploration of Luke's Gospel.

RECITALS

Each Sunday during full term there is a recital in Chapel at 5.25 p.m. before Evensong. Visitors are welcome, and admission is free. The recital is a preparation for the worship to follow, and those present are invited to reflect and meditate silently during the musical offering. There are no recitals on 12 November (Remembrance Sunday) or 26 November (Christ the King).

MUSIC

Musical highlights this Term include a liturgical performance of Herbert Howells' Requiem for All Souls' Day (2 November), Robert Ramsey's *How are the mighty fallen* as part of our special service for Remembrance Sunday (13 November), Schubert's *Mass No. 2 in G* with strings for our Choral Eucharist for Christ the King (26 November), and the first performance of a new setting of Responses by Clare alumna Caitlin Obee (early October). Alongside established repertoire the Choir continues to explore lesser-known works, including those by Aquilera de Heredia, Zoë Martlew, Hjálmar H. Ragnarsson, Joanna Marsh, and Iain Farrington.

The Choir is joined by the Choir of Clare Hall College (9 November), and by undergraduate Clare string players for Christ the King (26 November). In September the Choir sings Choral Evensong at St Andrew's, Stapleford (29 September) and on Tuesday 24 October gives a concert performance of Claudio Monteverdi's *Vespers of 1610* as the inaugural Great Hall Concert following the recently-completed refurbishment.

The two popular Clare Advent Carol Services this year take place on Tuesday 28 November and Thursday 30 November (admission by ticket only). The Choir sings Christmas Carols for the College Staff on Wednesday 29 November at 5.00 p.m. in the Riverside Café.

During the December vacation, the Choir tours across the USA and the Netherlands, and performs in London's St John's, Smith Square on Monday 18 December. Full details are available from the Chapel Office, or at <u>www.clarecollegechoir.com</u>.

FRESHERS' WEEK SERVICES & EVENTS

A COMMEMORATION OF HUGH LATIMER

At Choral Evensong on Thursday 12 October, we commemorate the life and martyrdom of Clare alumnus Hugh Latimer. Latimer was a Fellow of Clare, later Bishop of Worchester, and was burnt at the stake in Oxford in October 1555.

On Thursday 19 October, Clare students are invited to an informal evening conversation in E3 at 9 p.m., over wine. We're delighted to welcome back Clare alumnus Niv Lobo, who read English at the College from 2009 to 2012, and is now a priest in the Church of England. He'll be reflecting on his time as a student at Clare, and how his faith informed this. After a short talk, there will be plenty of time for questions and conversation, and we will finish at 10.00 p.m. All warmly welcome.

MONTEVERDI: VESPERS

Following the completion of its refurbishment, the inaugural Great Hall Concert takes place on Tuesday 24 October with a performance of Claudio Monteverdi's spectacular *Vespers of 1610* conducted by Graham Ross. The Choir will be joined by Clare alumni tenor Nicholas Mulroy, violinist Margaret Faultless, and lutenist Elizabeth Kenny, the period instrumentalists of the English Cornett and Sackbut Ensemble, and undergraduate string players from the University.
